#### Notes

On September 17, 2013, a Special Meeting of the Arkansas River Compact Administration (ARCA) was held in Holly, CO. Pursuant to its By-Laws, the Administration instructed staff to prepare a written summary of the Special Meeting in lieu of a verbatim transcript, and to preserve for the record an electronic copy of the audio recording of the meeting.

The following meeting summary was prepared by the staff of the Kansas Division of Water Resources from notes taken at the meeting, which was then reviewed by staff of the Colorado Water Conservation Board, and finalized after consultation between the two agencies. Audio recordings of the meeting were made by both the Kansas Division of Water Resources and the Colorado Water Conservation Board. These recordings will be made a part of the ARCA record.

#### **Summary of Record Meeting**

A Special Meeting of the Arkansas River Compact Administration (ARCA) was called to order at 1:00 PM (MST) in Holly Colorado on September 17, 2013. In absence of a federal Chair, the Vice-Chair, Randy Hayzlett, acted as Chair. Chairman Hayzlett recognized the three new ARCA reps: Hal Scheuerman, Kansas representative from Deerfield, KS; James Eklund, Colorado representative and Colorado Water Conservation Board Director; and Scott Brazil, Colorado representative from Pueblo, CO. Chairman Hayzlett asked David Barfield and James Eklund to recognize any legislative representatives and respective State staff. The members of the audience were then asked to introduce themselves. Approximately 90 people attended this meeting, which primarily consisted of farmers from both Colorado and Kansas, along with State, local water district, and federal water officials.

ARCA reviewed and approved the meeting agenda.

Chairman Hayzlett described the meeting purpose as being to inform ARCA on relevant parts of the Arkansas River Compact and the *Kansas v. Colorado* decree related to proposed developments by GP Irrigated Farms. GP Irrigated Farms was also present to provide information on those possible developments. The Chairman also made clear that no action would be taken at this meeting related to those proposed developments.

David Barfield, Chief Engineer for the Kansas Division of Water Resources and Kansas representative for ARCA, provided a review of the Compact development, Compact Article IV.D, and certain provisions of the *Kansas v. Colorado* decree. (See attachment C.)

Steve Witte, Division 2 Engineer for the Colorado Division of Water Resources, provided a review of Colorado water law as it relates to the proposed developments.

Ken Knox, an engineer for the GP Irrigated Farms, provided an overview of the proposed developments near Holly, Granada, and Lamar. He stated the purpose was to grow feedstock crops for both an existing dairy located near Syracuse, Kansas, and a proposed dairy that would be located south of Holly, Colorado. The developments primarily consist of replacement and new installation of center pivot irrigation systems. The new pivot installations would either be on lands currently irrigated by the flood-furrow method and/or new lands brought under irrigation. He also stated that the water supply for the new dairy south of Holly would come from the Southern High Plains Designated Groundwater Basin. It was also noted that there would be a dry gravel pit on the farm east of Lamar. He stated that these changes will have to meet Colorado rules and regulations. (See attachment D.)

After the presentations were over, ARCA asked questions pertaining to the development project. Once ARCA had asked their questions, Chairman Hayzlett informed that there would be a break to allow time for the public to submit written questions.







### **Arkansas River Compact**

- Long history of litigation and dispute over waters of Arkansas River
- 1943—U.S. Supreme Court encouraged States to enter into an interstate compact
- 1943-1948—Compact negotiations

### **Arkansas River Compact**

- Compact agreed to on December 14, 1948
- Adopted as statute in both States and as U.S. Public Law
- Major purposes (Article I):
  - "Settle existing disputes and remove causes of future controversy..."
  - "Equitably divide and apportion..." Arkansas River waters and the benefits of John Martin Reservoir

### Compact Article IV-D

"This Compact is not intended to impede or prevent future beneficial development of the Arkansas river basin in Colorado and Kansas by federal or state agencies, by private enterprise, or by combinations thereof, which may involve construction of dams, reservoirs and other works for the purposes of water utilization and control, as well as the improved or prolonged functioning of existing works: *Provided*, That the waters of the Arkansas river, as defined in Article III, shall not be materially depleted in usable quantity or availability for use to the water users in Colorado and Kansas under this Compact by such future developments or construction." (KSA 82a-520)

### **Recent Litigation**

- Kansas v. Colorado
  - 1985—Kansas filed suit; included complaint concerning post-compact depletion of river flows by irrigation wells drilled along the Arkansas River
  - Kansas prevailed on above point; resulted in U.S.
     Supreme Court finding Colorado in violation of the Compact
  - States negotiated a decree; entered by the U.S. Supreme Court in March 2009

#### Kansas v. Colorado decree

- Decree specifically provides that Colorado comply with Article IV-D and sets out the following:
  - To prevent Groundwater Pumping in excess of the pre-compact pumping allowance of 15,000 acre-feet per year without Replacement of depletions to Usable Stateline Flow in accordance with this Decree
  - To enforce the Colorado Use Rules with respect to groundwater pumping, unless John Martin Reservoir is spilling and Stateline water is passing Garden City, Kansas; and
  - To enforce the Colorado Measurement Rules with respect to Groundwater Pumping.

#### Kansas v. Colorado decree

- Determination of Compact compliance:
  - annual updates to H-I Model
  - annual accounting
  - moving ten-year compliance period
- 2010--Colorado adopted surface water irrigation improvement rules
- 2011--States agreed to model change that recognized groundwater irrigation system improvements
- Monitoring compliance:
  - accounting reviews
  - field investigations



# Protection of Water Rights in Colorado and Kansas

#### Irrigated acreage will operate under approved well permits

- Lands irrigated under existing groundwater well permits (Rule 14 Plan)
- Depletions under new lands will be replaced by a court approved plan for augmentation

# RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE DIVERSION AND USE OF TRIBUTARY GROUND WATER IN THE ARKANSAS RIVER BASIN, COLORADO

Rule 1. Scope. These Rules apply to all diversions of tributary ground water in the Arkansas River Basin in Colorado except diversions by decreed or permitted wells as described in section 37-92-602, wells located within a designated ground water basin which withdraw designated ground water, decreed and/or permitted wells which withdraw nontributary ground water, and exposure of ground water in connection with extraction of sand and gravel by open mining as defined in section 34-32-103(9), 14 C.R.S.

Rule 14. Applications for Approval of Plans to Divert Tributary Ground Water. No later than April 1, 1996, and no later than March 1 of each year thereafter, a well user or an entity acting on behalf of well users who desires approval of a plan to divert tributary ground water pursuant to these Rules must file with the division engineer an application in writing setting forth a complete description of the plan.

# Conversion from Surface Water Irrigation to Center-Pivots

### COMPACT RULES GOVERNING IMPROVEMENTS TO SURFACE WATER IRRIGATION SYSTEMS IN THE ARKANSAS RIVER BASIN IN COLORADO

ORDER OF THE STATE ENGINEER

BY THIS ORDER the State Engineer adopts the following rules and regulations to govern improvements to surface water irrigation systems in the Arkansas River Basin in Colorado to comply with Article IV-D of the Arkansas River Compact.

Rule 1. Title

The title of these Rules is "Compact Rules Governing Improvements to Surface Water Irrigation Systems in Arkansas River Basin in Colorado." The short title for these Rules is "Irrigation Improvement Rules," and they may be referred to herein collectively as the "Rules" or individually as a "Rule."

Rule 2. Authority

These Rules are promulgated pursuant to the authority granted the State Engineer in § 37-80-102(1)(a), § 37-80-104, and § 37-92-501, C.R.S., to ensure compliance with the terms of the Arkansas River Compact, 63 Stat. 145; § 37-69-101, et seq., C.R.S. (Compact).

Rule 3. Purpose

A.The purpose of these Rules is to ensure that improvements to surface water irrigation systems in the Arkansas River Basin in Colorado comply with Article IV-D of the Compact.


B.These Rules have as their objective the optimum use of waters of the Arkansas River in a manner consistent with preservation of the priority system of water rights while ensuring that the State of Colorado complies with the terms of the Compact.
