RESOLUTION 2016 - 02

Regarding the Resolution of Water Issues Matrix Issue 33 – Transit Loss on Reservoir-to-Reservoir Deliveries

WHEREAS, beginning in 2007 a dispute between the States arose regarding the "recapture of transit losses on reservoir-to-reservoir deliveries" (hereafter referred to as "this practice"); and

WHEREAS, this practice was added to the Water Issues Matrix in December 2008 as Issue 33; and

WHEREAS, this practice was based on information contained within the USGS Water Resources Investigations 78-75 that given certain assumptions the unconsumed portion of the transit loss would return to the river; and

WHEREAS, based on findings contained within the Russell K. Livingston report *Transit Losses* and *Travel Times of Reservoir Releases along the Arkansas River from Pueblo Reservoir to John Martin Reservoir* (January 2011) the Operations Secretary discontinued this practice; and

WHEREAS, the Operations Secretary documented discontinuing this practice in the Annual Report of the Operations Secretary Concerning the Operation of John Martin Reservoir for Compact Year 2011 (bottom of the 5th page in the pdf of this document); and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Arkansas River Compact Administration recognized with the discontinuation of recapture of transit losses on reservoir-to-reservoir deliveries from Compact Year 2011 forward, the controversy between the States has been removed.

ADOPTED by the Arkansas River Compact Administration at its 2016 Annual Meeting on December 2, 2016 in Lamar, Colorado.
